

CITY OF LAUDERHILL
DECLARATION OF STATE OF EMERGENCY
(SOE 20-12 Eighth 7-Day Extension & Phase 1 Re-Openings)

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020 at 5:52 p.m., Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-52 activating the Florida Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan and declaring that a State of Emergency exists in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Broward County Board of County Commissioners issued a Declaration of Emergency declaring Broward County under a Local State of Emergency on March 10, 2020 at 12:25 p.m.; and

WHEREAS, on March 2, 2020 at 11:30 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared a State of Emergency as to the Public Health Emergency (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-01); and

WHEREAS, on March 10, 2020 at 2:40 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared an actual State of Emergency (hereinafter referred to as SOE 20-02), based upon the Governor's Executive Order Number 20-52; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 8½ - 3(c), declarations of a state of emergency shall be for a period of time not to exceed seven (7) days at a time and may be extended for additional periods of time not to exceed seven (7) day increments; and

WHEREAS, on March 17, 2020 at 2:40 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the first seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-03) in the City of Lauderhill effective through March 24, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 24, 2020 at 2:25 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the second seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-04) in the City of Lauderhill effective through March 31, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 31, 2020 at 12:30 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the third seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-06) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 7, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 7, at 1:05 p.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fourth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-07) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 14, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 14, at 10:16 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the fifth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-09) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 21, at 8:45 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the sixth seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-10) in the City of Lauderhill effective through April 21, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, at 9:00 a.m., the City of Lauderhill declared the seventh seven (7) day extension of the Declaration of a State of Emergency (SOE 20-11) in the City of Lauderhill effective through May 5, 2020; and

WHEREAS this SOE 20-12 extends the Declaration of a State of Emergency for another seven (7) day extension; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2020, Broward County issued EO 20-08 effective April 29, 2020, which allowed for certain openings including parks, boating and marine activities, golf courses and pool amenities; and

WHEREAS, on April 29, 2020, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 20-112 providing for certain Phase 1 recovery provisions and re-openings of certain limited businesses effective May 4, 2020 in counties other than Miami-Dade, Broward and Palm Beach counties; and

WHEREAS, cities are allowed to impose more stringent requirement than those passed by Broward County or the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lauderhill hereby imposes the following more stringent requirements and only authorizes the following re-openings during Phase 1;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Desorae Giles-Smith, the Interim City Manager of the City of Lauderhill, at 9:25 a.m. on Tuesday, May 5, 2020, do hereby declare the following:

1. Extension of Declaration of State of Emergency. I hereby extend the declaration of a STATE OF EMERGENCY which exists in the City of Lauderhill for the eighth seven (7) day extension through May 11, 2020, unless otherwise terminated or extended.
2. Parks. The City of Lauderhill will begin reopening passive parks effective May 11, 2020. The following parks will open on May 11, 2020 for limited recreational activities to include walking and jogging at: Boulevard Woods Parks, 17th Street Park, Ilene Lieberman Botanical Gardens, Jackie Gleason Park, James Bradley Park, Mediation Park, 35th Avenue Greenway, Renaissance Park, Ruth Rothkopf Park, South Gateway Park, Waterford Park, and the lakeside of Wolk Park. All tennis and basketball courts, playgrounds, pavilions, and exercise areas are to remain closed. Park patrons must continue to adhere to CDC Guidelines.
3. Golf courses. The City of Lauderhill will open the Lauderhill Golf Course on May 11, 2020, but will follow the "Gold Course Limited Reopening Requirements" as set forth in Broward County EO 20-08.
4. All CDC Guidelines and Social Distancing requirements are to remain in effect citywide.
5. All other business and facility closures, to include association pools and the Swap Shop as specifically set forth in Lauderhill SOE 20-05 shall remain in effect until further notice. All other Federal, State, County, and City Emergency Orders shall remain in effect unless expressly stated otherwise.
6. The provisions of this Emergency Order may be enforced within the boundaries of the City of Lauderhill by the City's law enforcement agency, as well as the City's Code Enforcement Officers and Rangers in accordance with Florida Statutes §252.50 and City Code §8½-7.
