

Bullet Points for Broward County EO 20-20 effective 11:59 pm July 2nd

Limitation on Restaurant & Food Establishment Hours – NO on-site alcohol consumption and NO on-site dining is allowed past 12:01 a.m. through 5 am.

Facial Coverings Required – Facial coverings are mandatory in ALL PUBLIC SPACES outside the geographical boundaries of their residence if social distancing of at least six feet (6') between persons not of the same household cannot be maintained, unless an express exception applies. The covering MUST cover the nose and the mouth and comply with CDC guidelines. (This coincides with Lauderhill's recent EO and basically means that a facial covering must be worn at all times in all places other than private residences unless expressly listed on the list of exceptions at the bottom – e.g. under age 2, health condition, religion reason, etc.). This applies to all incorporated and unincorporated areas in Broward County.

These are minimum standards and cities may enforce stricter requirements.

Facial Coverings are REQUIRED in the following situations REGARDLESS OF WHETHER SOCIAL DISTANCING CAN BE MAINTAINED OR NOT:

- ALL persons **in any** establishment, business or amenity operating in Broward County (referred to as “Establishment” hereafter).
- ALL persons **while working** in any establishment allowed to operate per EO.
- Members of the public when obtaining any good or services or otherwise visiting any establishment; including entering, exiting and otherwise moving around within the establishment.
- **All workers** of any establishment while involved in the **preparation, handling or service of food.**
- ALL persons while **in any common areas** of a **multi-family housing development or residential facility**, including without limitation the reception area, hallways and elevators.
- As required in all other Governor or Broward County Emergency Orders when indicated that facial masks are required to be worn.

Facial Coverings are NOT REQUIRED to be worn:

- **Child under age 2**, and any child (regardless of age) when in the custody of a licensed childcare facility or day care center.
- Persons receiving goods or services for the shortest practical period of time when in order to receive the good or service would preclude the wearing of the facial covering (i.e. eating, drinking, shaving)
- Persons with **disability or medical condition** which prevents the person from safely wearing a facial covering. (They recommend an alternate method of accommodation if available)
- Public health and safety, fire and other life safety personnel PPEs are governed by their agencies
- **While actively engaging in strenuous activity or exercise** that renders the wearing of the facial covering unsafe.
- All establishments are responsible to ensure that ALL EMPLOYEES and ALL PATRONS wear facial coverings.
