

HOMESTEAD and other EXEMPTIONS

The Florida Constitution provides a tax-saving exemption on the first and third \$25,000 of the assessed value of an owner/occupied residence. The additional \$25,000 only applies to the non-schools portion of your tax bill.

Senior Exemption – In order to qualify for the Low-Income Senior Exemption an applicant must be 65 or older as of January 1, receive Homestead Exemption on the property, and have a combined household adjusted gross income not exceeding \$30,721.

Long-term Residency Senior Exemption – applicant must have maintained permanent residence on the property for at least 25 years, while meeting the age and income requirements above and the applicant's property must have a value less than \$250,000 for initial year of application.

Rating Action: Moody's affirms Lauderhill, FL's A1 GO and A1 special tax ratings; removes negative outlook

New York, August 31, 2020 -- Moody's Investors Service has affirmed the City of Lauderhill, FL's A1 general obligation unlimited tax (GOULT) and A1 special tax ratings. The negative outlook has been removed.

RATINGS RATIONALE

The A1 GOULT rating reflects the city's adequate financial position with below-average available fund balance levels. The rating also reflects its moderately-sized and growing tax base, below average wealth and income levels, and elevated debt and pension burdens.

The A1 rating on the capital improvement revenue bonds reflects the ample coverage of maximum annual debt service (MADS) by the pledged revenues, as well as the favorable trend and low volatility of the pledged revenues. The rating also reflects the moderately weak legal features which include no requirement for a debt service reserve and a 1.5 times additional-bonds test.

We regard the coronavirus outbreak as a social risk under our ESG framework, given the substantial implications for public health and safety. The coronavirus crisis is not a key driver for this rating action. We do not see any material immediate credit risks for the City of Lauderhill. However, the situation surrounding coronavirus is rapidly evolving and the longer term impact will depend on both the severity and duration of the crisis. If our view of the credit quality of the city changes, we will update the rating and/or outlook at that time.

RATING OUTLOOK

The removal of the negative outlook reflects the city's efforts to improve its financial position, including increases to its fire fees over the last two years, which management projects will allow modest improvement in the fire protection fund balance over the next seven to ten years as the interfund loans are paid back. The city's reserves and liquidity will also improve given the recent increases in its property tax rate paired with continued growth in the tax base.

FACTORS THAT COULD LEAD TO AN UPGRADE OF THE RATINGS

- Maintenance of structurally-balanced operations, with growth in fund balance reserves and liquidity (GOULT rating)
- Improvement of the city's socioeconomic indicators (GOULT rating)
- Decreased fixed costs (GOULT rating)
- Upgrade of the GO rating (special tax only)

Education

Education can be measured using continuous variables (e.g., highest year of school completed) or categorical variables (e.g., 1-6 scale indicating the highest grade completed). Higher levels of education are often associated with better economic outcomes, as well as the expansion of social resources (APA, 2007).

Income

Income can be measured in a variety of ways, including family income, assessments of wealth and subjective assessments of economic pressure. At the neighborhood and societal level, federal poverty thresholds, supplemental poverty measures and school and neighborhood level indicators of poverty can be assessed. Lack of income has been found to be related to poorer health, mainly due to reduced access to goods and services (such as health care) that can be beneficial to health (APA, 2007).

Occupation

Occupation can be assessed by asking participants to note their current or most recent occupation or job title, or to indicate their occupational category from a list. Aside from financial benefits, employment can improve one's physical and mental health and expand social networks (APA, 2007). However, the nature of lower SES positions can undermine these benefits, as the job itself may be hazardous or monotonous (APA, 2007).

Workforce housing is commonly targeted at “essential workers” in a community i.e. police officers, firemen, teachers, nurses, medical personnel.




Lauderhill Fire Department along with Grants Division applied and received a grant for 12 additional Firefighters at no cost to the City. This is \$4.7 million.






* Includes a one-time historical data submission from a large laboratory. The percent positivity on 8/31 excluding the historical data submission was 5.74%.

Blue lines illustrate 7-day moving average


