





 - Broward County – Implemented 25 Emergency Orders and Extensions
 - Participated in weekly conference calls with County, BCCMA, and State

City of Lauderhill

City is VIRTUALLY OPEN for Business September 30, 2020

- City is open to the virtually open to the public
- Tele-working and flex scheduling is available
- Daily Covid-19 Screening is required to enter premises
- Lauderhill Events cancelled until November 1, 2020
- Lauderhill Performing Arts – Open for Rentals only with waiver and following approved COVID-19 Plan
- Projected Date to Re-open City Hall and City Facilities is October 26, 2020

Lauderhill Cares I Program

- Process 103 Res applications
- Process 43 Business Application
- Approved Residential 21 (\$23,100)(CLOSED)
- Approved Business 20 (\$51,250)

City is taking calls and emails to discuss the program and assist in processing the program

The residential program is CLOSED. The Business Program is extended with and additional \$51,900. The business amount is increased from \$75,000 to \$126,000.

Broward County Small Business Grant Program

One-time grant awards will be available to business owners in amounts of \$5,000, \$10,000, or \$15,000. The grant award provides working capital financial assistance to further the economic viability of recipients.

Eligible costs may include:

Payroll for employee retention
Commercial property lease or mortgage payments
Electric Utilities
Business development costs such as professional services, inventory/supplies/equipment, professional services, or other expenses occurring in the ordinary course of business

COVID19 related expenses due to new safety provisions

Cover other applicable expenditures to help support interruptions caused by COVID

Technical Advisory Services

Broward County will work with multiple partners to provide technical advisory services to assist grant applicants. Technical advisory services of up to 90 minutes would be provided to all potential applicants seeking assistance. Technical Advisory Services will include:

Understanding pre/post grant terms and requirements

Assembling the necessary documentation to meet the application requirements

Application Review Services

The County may utilize prequalified community-based businesses to assist the County in reviewing applications. These services will include:

State of Florida Governor's Order 20-244

1. Eliminates all restrictions of Executive Orders 20-112, 20-123, 20-139, 20-192, 20-214, and 20-223
2. No COVID-19 emergency order may prevent an individual from working or business from operating
3. Only limit restaurant capacity to 50% with study and explanation
4. Suspends all collection of fines and penalties





Percent positivity for new cases in Florida residents



Daily new cases




Emergency room visits week ending 9/26

COVID-like illnesses






Five-Day Graphical Tropical Weather Outlook
