







State of Florida Changes Website

Location at(confirmed) Lauderdale Sports Park

The **Lauderhill Sports Park** will be a testing location provided by the Florida Department of Emergency Management. This is a walk-up location and no prescription is necessary for testing. You must bring a government-issued ID and have a working cell phone number. Results are texted to you.

The hours of operation are from **9:00 AM to 5:00 PM SEVEN days of the week**, with a maximum of 500 tests available daily on a first-come, first-serve basis. At the request of **Representative Anika Omphroy and the City of Lauderdale City Commission**, this testing site remains open daily.

NOTE: In cases of inclement weather, the site may close for a period of time for safety of the public and staff.








COVID-19 Daily Hospitalizations

COVID Isolation Facility Update



The Agency established COVID isolation facilities to support long-term care providers and help with hospital decompression during the COVID-19 public health emergency. We are grateful for the critical role these facilities have played in the State's battle against COVID-19.


Based on the dramatic decrease in positivity among residents and staff in long-term care facilities, the significant reduction in the number of individuals hospitalized for COVID-19, and increased hospital capacity, the Agency has initiated a process to phase out the role of and to end the agreements with the State-supported COVID-19 isolation facilities.

Please note: With the exception of the Miami Care Center, these facilities may choose to continue to accept COVID positive patients as long as they follow appropriate isolation and infection control protocols **adhering to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommendations**. Please work directly with the facilities to determine if they will continue to accept COVID positive patients once the contract with the Agency ends.

Effective September 18, 2020, the following facilities will no longer be admitting COVID positive patients under a contract with the Agency:






~Florida has Sixty-One Consecutive Days of New Case Positivity Rate Below 10 Percent~

A person is only counted once for each day they are tested, regardless of whether multiple specimens are tested or multiple results are received. If a person has a positive specimen and a negative specimen in the same day, only the positive result is counted.


